



## Welcome to Glanusk Caravan Park at Glanusk Estate

### GETTING HERE AND GATE ACCESS

**Access to Glanusk Caravan Park is from the B4558 Cwm Crawnnon Road only.** If you are approaching from the Brecon direction on the A40 do **not** turn right on the A40 at Bwlch towards Llangynidr whatever Sat Nav says as this will take you to a very narrow and impassable bridge. Instead carry on past our main gates and then turn right by the petrol station over the Crickhowell Bridge and then turn right onto the B4558 Cwm Crawnnon Road. To gain access to the park from the B4558 gate key in the code **7860** followed by the [enter] key. To exit the park from the B4558 gate simply approach the gate slowly and they will open automatically. **There is no vehicular access to or from the A40 Main Entrance via the Glanusk Bridge.**

### CHECK IN AND CHECK OUT

**Check in time is after 1pm and before 6pm** (if you are arriving late please inform us by calling the office on 01873 810414) and **check out is by 12pm**. Please contact the Estate Office (01873 810414) if you require a late check out, additional charges may apply. Guests are responsible for leaving the site in good order and in a clean condition.

### BBQ

Open camp fires are not permitted on the park under any circumstances. Free standing BBQs are permitted on the site as long as they are raised more than 8 inches from the ground. No gas BBQs are permitted.

### FIREPIT

Please feel free to use the communal fire pit using fallen twigs and branches.

### FIRE

You should make yourself aware of all fire safety instructions and precautions

### FIREWORKS AND CHINESE LANTERNS

The use of fireworks and Chinese Lanterns is strictly forbidden.

### LIGHTING

Lighting is generally low level subdued lighting and spaced to meet local authority restrictions, reduce the environmental impact comply with planning permission and reduce the effect of light pollution. We suggest taking a torch with you if you leave your caravan after dark and sticking to a familiar route if you need to walk around the site after dark.

### DOGS

Dogs are welcome and must be on leads to protect our livestock and your dog. There is a dedicated dog walking field to the le^ of the caravan park. Access to the Woodland Walk which leads to the Glanusk Tower (see **pink** route on the map) is on the right. Please clear up after your dog. Poo bags are provided.

## NATURAL HAZARDS

We encourage wildlife and maintain natural surroundings where possible, so take care when walking around the site. Molehills and rabbit holes, tree roots and uneven ground are likely to be present. We advise you to keep your eyes peeled for hazards and wear appropriate footwear.

## RIVER ACCESS

The Woodland Walk and Beach Walk lead down to the River Usk. Please be aware that there is strictly no swimming for humans or dogs at any time for your own safety, that of your dog and not to disturb the river for paying anglers as loud noises and splashing will scare the fish away. Day licenses to fish for trout and salmon on our 5 mile stretch of the river can be purchased at the Estate Office during the fishing season.

## PERMISSIVE PATH

The 'Permissive' foot-path runs through the Estate and goes from Penmyarth Park (North of the River Usk) to Glanusk Park (South of the River). Please keep to the designated path, details of which you will find on the attached map. Dogs must be kept on leads at all times, this is to protect our livestock and your dogs.

## DRIVING AND WALKING AROUND THE ESTATE

The speed limit all over the Estate is 10 miles per hour. Please avoid driving on the verges. If you meet someone coming the other way, please reverse to a suitable passing place. If you are walking on the Estate and happen to stray, you may be approached by one of the Glanusk Team or a tenant farmer. Please tell them who you are and where you are staying. We keep an eye out for your own safety and tenants who live and work on the estate, so please don't take offence.

## TREES

There are many beautiful trees on the Estate including over 300 different species and cultivars of Oaks. From time to time a bough may fall from the trees, so we would advise all guests to avoid standing under, climbing, or picnicking under the trees. You will see that in some places we have roped off the areas around the trees and this is part of an on-going management programme. However, we would ask that you avoid standing under, climbing or picnicking under all the trees on The Estate whether they are roped off or not.

**Please warn your children of the dangers and ensure they are supervised at all times.**

## OAK COLLECTION AND GARDEN

By arrangement only. Group tours can be arranged to include refreshments. Please contact the Estate Office on 01873 810414 to arrange a visit or tour.

We are located on and near to farms, take care as there are animals around that can behave unpredictably, so parental supervision is required. Please don't let children get close to the animals unless given permission by the farmer. Always wash your hands after contact with animals.



**Crickhowell** is 2 miles away and is accessible by car, cycle or a pleasant walk along the Mon & Brec Canal (see **blue** path on map for canal access) or along the River Usk (see **red** path on map from the Glanusk Tower). Our friendly town has butchers, bakers, cafes, restaurants, antiques, clothes, gift and book shops, galleries and our local information centre.

**Llangynidr** is approximately 2.5 miles away and accessible by car, cycle or a walk along the Mon & Brec Canal towpath (see **blue** path on map for canal access).

**Talybont** is approximately 7 miles away and accessible by car, cycle or walking along the Mon & Brec Canal towpath (see **blue** path on map for canal access). Talybont has a number of pubs, a cafe and local shop, as well as a play area, bike cleaning and children's play equipment.

**Brecon** is approximately 11 miles away and accessible by car, cycle or a pleasant walk along the Mon & Brec Canal towpath (see **blue** path on map for canal access).

**Abergavenny** is approximately 7 miles away and accessible by car, cycle or a pleasant walk along the Mon & Brec Canal towpath (see **blue** path on map for canal access).

**Brecon Beacons National Visitor Centre** is 18 miles by car or cycle with a cafe, shop and parking.

**Brecon Mountain Railway** is approximately 18 miles away, on the way enjoy a walk at **Ponsticill Reservoir** and visit **The Old Barn Tea Rooms Ponsrticill**.

**Hay on Wye** "*Town of books*" is 18 miles away and has an abundance of interesting shops. Thursday is Hay Market Day from 8am to mid-afternoon.

**Talgarth** has an historic working mill, the Melin Talgarth Mill, with a lovely bakery and restaurant attached to it. The Talgarth Information Centre is situated at the Tower Shop at The Square.

Wales is home to some of Europe's finest surviving medieval **castles** and in the **Brecon Beacons** guests are spoilt for choice. Please note that not all attractions may be fully open so it's wise to phone ahead or check their websites for opening information • Brecon Castle • Carreg Cennen Castle, Llandeilo • Crickhowell Castle • Cyfartha Castle, Merthyr Tydfil • Llandovery Castle • Newton House, Dinefwr • Tretower Court.

## The Glanusk Permissive Path

The Glanusk Permissive Footpath runs through the Estate between the A40 and the B4558, and by the bridge along the River Usk to and from Crickhowell. Please enjoy your walk through The Park and the many fascinating historical and ecological features which are a part of it. These include Grade II\* listed buildings, many different species of oak, the beautiful Usk River and the unique parkland.

Whilst we wish you to enjoy your time in this special environment, we must stress that it is a working estate and so you must keep to the footpath. It should be noted that it is a footpath and as such the following are not permitted:

Bicycles • Fires • Horses • Motorised vehicles • Picnics • Swimming or otherwise disturbing the river and fishing

From the caravan park you can either walk through the Woodland Walk to **The Tower** (see **pink** route on the map) or head towards the back gates and walk through the barn area, turn left towards the hill where you can either turn left towards **The Tower** and then pick up the **Permissive Path** on the right after the Tower towards **The Nantyffyn Cider Mill** and **Crickhowell** or turn right through the stable yard and then turn right up the **Mon & Brec Canal** (see **red** route on the map). There is also direct access from the dog walking field to the **Mon & Brec Canal** (see **blue** route on the map). Users must not stray from the route of the footpath.

## Terms of Use

**Please stick to the path.** Please be considerate of guests and tenants when walking near any properties on the Estate before 8am. There is strictly no access to any stable yard buildings, Garden Cottage, Glanusk Lodge or West Lodge. Our guests and tenant's privacy must be respected at all times. The permitted footpath is only to be used in daylight hours.

The landowner accepts no liability for the use of the permitted footpath.

Parts of the permitted footpath may be closed from time to time for Estate Management purposes and during events in the Park. Access to private events is by invitation or ticket only.

All gates must be closed and all litter taken home with you.

Dogs must be kept on leads **at all times** and their poo picked up and disposed of responsibly.

Care must be taken when using the permitted footpath along the river. Please note this part of the permitted footpath is not passable following heavy rain as the area is liable to flooding.
